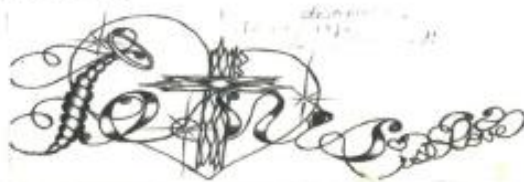
David was a happy runner. He would run and couldn't be caught. Because he had a muscular physique as a toddler, his dad named him "Plum Juicy." As David grew up, he also ran into many difficulties because of his physical stature and his loving and giving character. He began working with Teens Against Drugs and Alcohol in Orlando at the age of twelve. He worked with them for about two years. As a teenager, he sold CD's for the "Music Man" at Citgo on Pine Hills near Silver Star for three years. Later, David worked as a temporary worker at Orlando Bakery for a year and a half. His last employer was Central Florida Press where he started as a temporary worker for about a year and half. In February 2015, he was hired full-time at Central Florida Press where he was described as an exciting, loving and hard-working young man. David will be missed and his memories will dearly linger in the hearts of those who knew him.

David was preceded in death by his father, Darnell Tyrone White on December 1, 1997; his brother, JP "King" White on September 28, 2016; his maternal grandmother, Daisy B. Stark, November 30, 2011; his paternal grandmother, Annie Ruth White; and his uncle, William Kaigler.

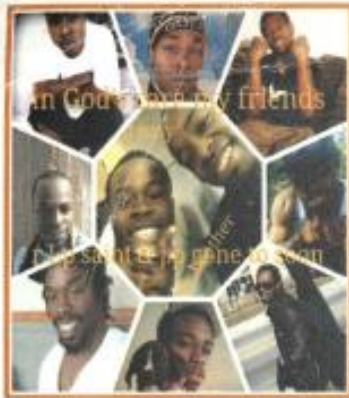
