Jo Anne Feldstein modeled in New York City for more than a decade during the late 1940s and 1950s. "It was the best time," she said. "The war was over, fabric was available, people had jobs. Everything was go."

Following her modeling career, Feldstein returned to school to earn her master's degree and then went on to pursue her Ph.D. in sociology at the City University of New York (CUNY). She left CUNY with all but her dissertation completed toward her doctorate. Feldstein devoted the second half of her professional life to helping people with addictions through a 23-year career with a substance abuse clinic in New York.

Feldstein retired to Orlando in the mid 1990s and was immediately drawn toward the library. She said, "I love the library so much. It's one of the best things about Orlando." Feldstein has been volunteering in the Friends of the Library Bookstore since 2006.
